





Dear Tribal Leader,

The State of California is committed to honoring Tribal sovereignty and supporting Tribal Governments in closing the digital divide in Indian Country. To this end, the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) and the California Department of Technology (CDT) request an opportunity to formally consult with California Tribal Governments to inform development of the Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Plan and the Digital Equity Plan.

The internet is critical to everyday life. Yet affordable, reliable internet service – and the devices, skills, and training to utilize it – is not yet equitably accessible to Tribal communities across the state. With unprecedented federal funding opportunities for broadband in California, understanding the unique needs of California Tribes as it relates to infrastructure development, adoption and digital literacy is critical.

The consultation process honors Tribal sovereignty, and the time and expertise you are able to share with us. Specifically, we seek to understand the concerns and needs of Tribal communities as it relates to broadband infrastructure, access, and deployment, and learn how the CPUC and CDT can partner with you to ensure Tribes can take full advantage of these historic funding opportunities.

Below are the dates and locations where CPUC and CDT, with the support of the Newsom Administration and the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA), will hold in-person and virtual Tribal consultations:

In addition to the above regional and virtual Government to Government consultations, the CPUC and CDT welcome the opportunity to conduct individual Government-to-Government consultations on an as requested basis.
