





Action Plan

GOAL 1:

All Californians have high-performance broadband available at home, schools, libraries, and businesses.

GOAL 2:

All Californians have access to affordable broadband and necessary devices.

GOAL 3:

All Californians can access training and support to enable digital inclusion.

BB4All Action Plan: Permitting

Action Item 6: CDT to explore various actions to enhance permitting processes at all levels of government through meaningful partnerships.

Local: Developed California <u>local jurisdiction broadband deployment and permitting playbook</u>, had roundtables with local jurisdictions.

State: Established programmatic permitting agreements and provided funding resources to state agencies for middle mile staffing prioritization.

Federal: Signed Letter of Intent with federal permitting agencies to support broadband permitting approaches to benefit Middle Mile Broadband Network.

In 2022 revised the action item to include other key parties, GO Biz, CETF, CDOT




