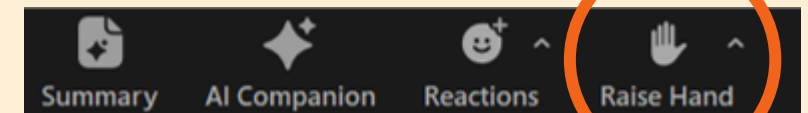
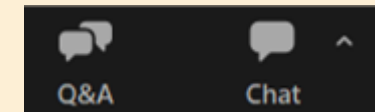
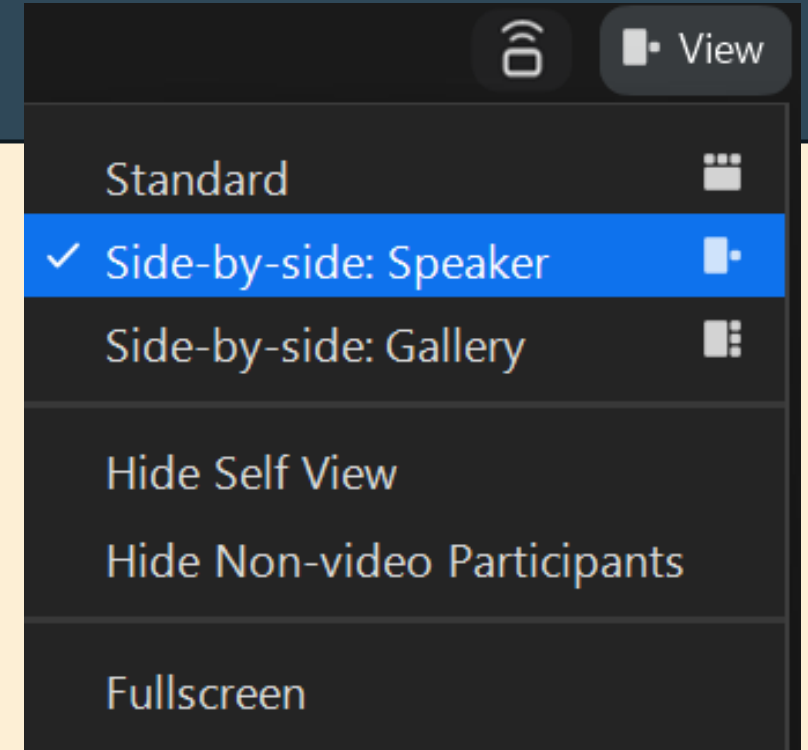

Overview	Requirements	Model Application
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Purpose:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Develop and refine regional and local digital equity plans.• Provide capacity to implement digital equity activities directly or through 2nd-tier subgrants.• Funding:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Formula allocation per county geographic boundary.• Will only award one application per county funding allocation.• Lead Applicant with partnerships per county boundary is encouraged.• Lead Applicant may also partner with entities across multiple counties to submit one application for multiple funding allocations.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Regional/local DE plan development or refinement to align with the SDEP.<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Plan must be completed and approved by CDT before CalDEP awards may be used for implementation of activities.• Plan must outline strategies, key activities, and measurable objectives to benefit members of all Covered Populations within the county in alignment with SDEP• Implementation of local DE activities that align with SDEP measurable objectives and regional/local digital equity plan.• Coalitions or partnerships formed with key stakeholders for planning and implementation. Must submit more than one LOI/LOS from partners/stakeholders from county/region.• Second-tier subgranting to other Eligible Entities to assist with implementation (optional).	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lead Applicant experience and capacity:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• With experience, reach, and partnerships across their specified county or multi-county region.• With experience managing large initiatives, federal or state grants, and making grants or subgrants to other organizations (if proposed)• Local partners representing Covered Populations and digital equity practitioners.• Knows local DE landscape: Applicant Team has strong understanding of the DE landscape in county/region.• Application aligns with SDEP goals, measurable objectives, targets, implementation strategy, and key activities.• Second-tier subgrants to community partners and DE practitioners to implement DE activities and strengthen the local DE ecosystem.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Purpose:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Statewide ecosystem development, planning, and innovation.• For a specific Covered Population or Outcome Area.• Funding:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Awards in \$400,000 - \$1,000,000 range• Up to 14 awards expected.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Statewide ecosystem development, capacity-building, or DE innovation that benefits a specific Covered Population or Outcome Area.• Track 1 coordination, support, or sharing of best practices.• Statewide Implementation Group participation (or in other communities of practice established by CDT).• Stakeholder engagement across the state. Must submit more than one LOI/LOS from partners/stakeholders across California.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lead Applicant experience and capacity:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• With experience, reach, and partnerships across the state's diverse regions, specializing in one Covered Population or Outcome Area.• With experience managing large initiatives and federal or state grants• Local partners representing Covered Populations and digital equity practitioners.• Large-scale implementation or innovation: Application has plan for large-scale, statewide DE implementation or ecosystem development, and/or an innovative idea.• Justification for targeted statewide ecosystem: Application demonstrates why the specified Covered Population or Outcome Area is better served at the statewide level (instead of regional/local level).
