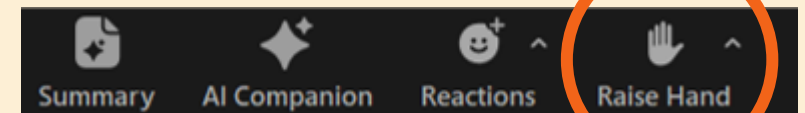
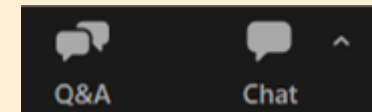
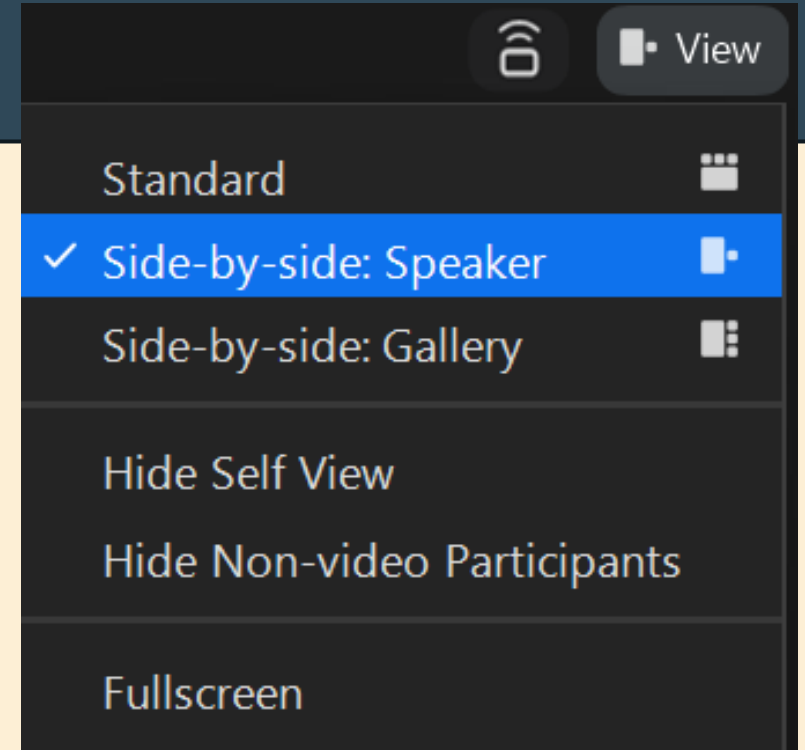

CalDEP Funding Track Summary—Track 1
Regional/Local Digital Equity Ecosystems (Planning + Capacity and Implementation)

Overview
Track 1 is designed to provide subgrants at the county or multi-county level. Track 1 subgrants are for (1) developing and refining regional and local digital equity plans that align with the State Digital Equity Plan (SDEP) and (2) providing capacity to implement digital equity activities directly or through second-tier subgrants to local Eligible Entities that align with strategies, key activities and measurable objectives in the SDEP.

Funding
• Funding is allocated by county geographic areas. Each county geographic area's formula-based funding allocation is specified in RFA 7, Allocation & Award Formula.
• Track 1 Lead Applicants may apply for one or more county funding allocations.
• CDT will only award one application per county funding allocation, and the awarded application will receive the entirety of the county's funding allocation.
• CDT encourages Lead Applicants to identify partnerships of interested entities within each county.
• Applications will be scored based on the Lead Applicant's experience and capacity, among other evaluation criteria as specified in the RFA.

Program Requirements
Track 1 applications must align with the following program requirements and expectations:
• Develop or refine a regional/local digital equity plan that aligns with the California SDEP and meets minimum requirements outlined in the RFA.
• Each plan must outline strategies, key activities, and measurable objectives to benefit members of all Covered Populations within the county/counties in alignment with the SDEP.
• Each plan must be completed and approved by CDT before CalDEP awards may be used for implementation of activities.
• Each plan must address the entirety of the county or multi-county area it represents. If a Lead Applicant is awarded for a multi-county area, a regional/local digital equity plan must be submitted for each county.
• Implement local digital equity activities that align with SDEP measurable objectives and regional/local digital equity plan.

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CalDEP Funding Track Summary—Track 2
Targeted Statewide Digital Equity Ecosystems (Covered Populations or Outcome Areas)

Overview
Track 2 is designed to provide subgrants at the statewide level. Track 2 subgrants will support ecosystem development, planning, and innovation for a specific State Outcome Area or Covered Population which may be served more effectively in statewide, rather than regional or local, ecosystems. If awarded, Track 2 Subgrantees will be expected to coordinate, collaborate and support Track 1 Subgrantees and their second-tier subgrantees.

Funding
• Track 2 subgrant awards will fall within the range of \$400,000 to \$1,000,000.
• CDT expects to make up to 14 awards under Track 2.

Program Requirements
Track 2 applications must align with the following program requirements and expectations:
• Engage in statewide ecosystem development, capacity-building, or digital equity innovation that benefits a specific Covered Population or Outcome Area.
• Include a plan to support, coordinate, or share best practices with Track 1 Subgrantees, and participate in and contribute to the Statewide Implementation Group and other communities of practice established by CDT.
• Engage stakeholders across the state.
• Track 2 applications must include more than one Letter of Intent or Letter of Support from partners or stakeholders across the state.
• Contribute to CDT's ongoing collection of responses to Statewide Digital Equity Public Survey and DEEM tool.
Additionally, it is permissible, but not required, for Track 2 Lead Applicants to make second-tier subgrants to other Eligible Entities across the state to assist with implementation of local digital equity activities.

Model Applications
A model, or competitive, Track 2 application may include the following components:
• A Lead Applicant with experience, reach, and partnerships across the state's diverse regions, specializing in serving one Covered Population or Outcome Area.
• A Lead Applicant with experience managing large initiatives and managing federal or state grants.
• Local partners representing Covered Populations or Outcome Areas and digital equity practitioners identified by the time of application to strengthen the statewide digital equity ecosystem.
• The application outlines a plan for large-scale, statewide digital equity activity implementation and ecosystem coordination and/or demonstrates an innovative idea.
• The application demonstrates why the specified Covered Population or Outcome Area is better served at the statewide level instead of at the local/regional level.

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5/6/25 Grant Guidelines and RFA Updates

Changes to RFA & RFA Materials are outlined below:

RFA, Section 9.2. Review Process

To be eligible for award, applications must:

- Score above zero points on Evaluation Metrics related to:
 - Need, Purpose and Benefits
 - Strength of Applicant's Organizational Capacity
- Receive a total score of at least 70 points.
 - Track 1 applications for counties receiving the minimum allocation (\$215,000) must receive a score of at least 60 points

Allowable / Unallowable Costs and Activities

Updates to *Supplies and Materials, Including Costs of Computing Devices*

- **Allowable** for costs of smartphones and cell phones for Subgrantee or Second-tier Subgrantee staff use.
- **Unallowable** for costs of smartphones and cell phones for participant take-home devices.

[Q&A Section] 4. Eligible Applicants

Are organizations allowed to submit more than one application?

Organizations may be part of multiple applications as programmatic Partners. However, Organizations serving as Lead Applicants are allowed to submit only one (1) application per funding Track.

Note: a Lead Applicant for Track 1 may partner with entities across multiple counties (whether the counties are contiguous or non-contiguous) to submit one application for multiple county funding allocations.

What are the eligibility requirements for Lead Applicants and second-tier subgrantees?

Both Lead Applicants and second-tier subgrantees for CalDEP must be located and operate in the State of California, have an active Unique Entity ID (UEI) number assigned by SAM.gov and an Employer Identification Number (EIN) assigned by the Internal Revenue Service, and belong to one of the federally defined Eligible Entity categories.

[Q&A Section] 4. Eligible Applicants

Do the roles of partners contributing Letters of Support and Letters of Intent need to be specified at the time the letters are submitted?

No. Per the [RFA Section 4. Eligible Applicants](#) Letters of Support (LOS) allow for stakeholders to express general support or endorsement for the application. A template can be found as part of Technical Assistance Resources [here](#). (See a more detailed response on the [Q&A page](#))

Is a for-profit organization delivering workforce development programs be eligible for CalDEP funding?

Yes. However, a for-profit workforce development program may be ineligible for CalDEP funding if it charges members of Covered Populations for services intended to be provided by the CalDEP award. Please see [RFA Section 7.2 Funding Restrictions](#) for more information. Please note this is not an exhaustive list and all applicants must align with eligibility requirements as detailed in [RFA Section 4. Eligible Applicants](#).

[Q&A Section] 5. Eligible Use of Funds and Program Requirements (Track 1 & Track 2)

In the Application Portal, Track 2 applicants are asked to select whether their application is proposing to serve either a specific Covered Population or an Outcome Area. Can applicants propose to serve both a specific Covered Population and an Outcome Area?

No. As noted in the [RFA Section 5. Eligible Use of Funds and Program Requirements](#), Track 2 is designed to fund subgrantees focusing on targeted ecosystem development or digital equity innovation for a specific Covered Population or Outcome Area. In the [Application Portal](#), applicants must select the specific Covered Population or Outcome Area that their application will focus on.

[Q&A Section] 7. Allocation & Award Formula (Anticipated Award Amounts & Funding Restrictions)

For Track 2, is an applicant able to request more than \$1 million in funding?

No. As noted in the RFA Section [7. Allocation & Award Formula](#), CDT expects to award Track 2 subgrants within the range of \$400,000 to \$1,000,000.

[Q&A Section] 10. Post-Award Expectations

How frequently will reimbursements be processed?

Subgrantees may submit reimbursement requests on a quarterly basis.
