## 3. Spotlight

On April 2, the California Department of Technology (CDT) hit a major milestone in the State's effort to close the digital divide. CDT has officially turned on a portion of the nation's largest state-owned middle-mile network and connected its first community, the Bishop Paiute Tribe. Students at the Bishop Indian Education Center were among the first to use this connection, experiencing speeds as much as 10x faster. As the network continues to attract internet service providers, thousands of residents in the Eastern Sierra and millions more communities across the state will gain access to reliable and affordable high-speed internet.
